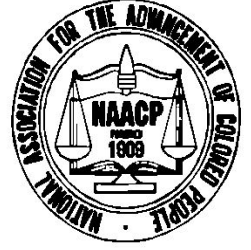

Some Tips to Make Zooms Video Conference Calls Better

- **Mute your audio** when not speaking. **TIP:** Holding the Space bar down on your laptop will temporarily 'Unmute' so you can speak. Forgive me in advance if I interrupt or Mute you.
- To the extent practical we want to make this interactive and conversational, but we can't all talk at once. Please be concise (1-minute) to make a point or ask a question.
- The preferred way is to use the **Chat function** to submit questions, share information, or raise your hand to request to speak. This minimizes 'talking on top of' the speaker or each other
- Put light in front towards your face, not behind you, else you look like a silhouette
- Plan to join the 5-8 minutes before the start time; in case of any start-up questions or problems
- When you login you will enter the 'Waiting Room'; we will quickly let folks into the meeting before the start, it may take longer once the meeting is underway
- Be Patient and Let's Enjoy Being Together (*Virtually*)!!
