COVID-19: What are we looking at this year?

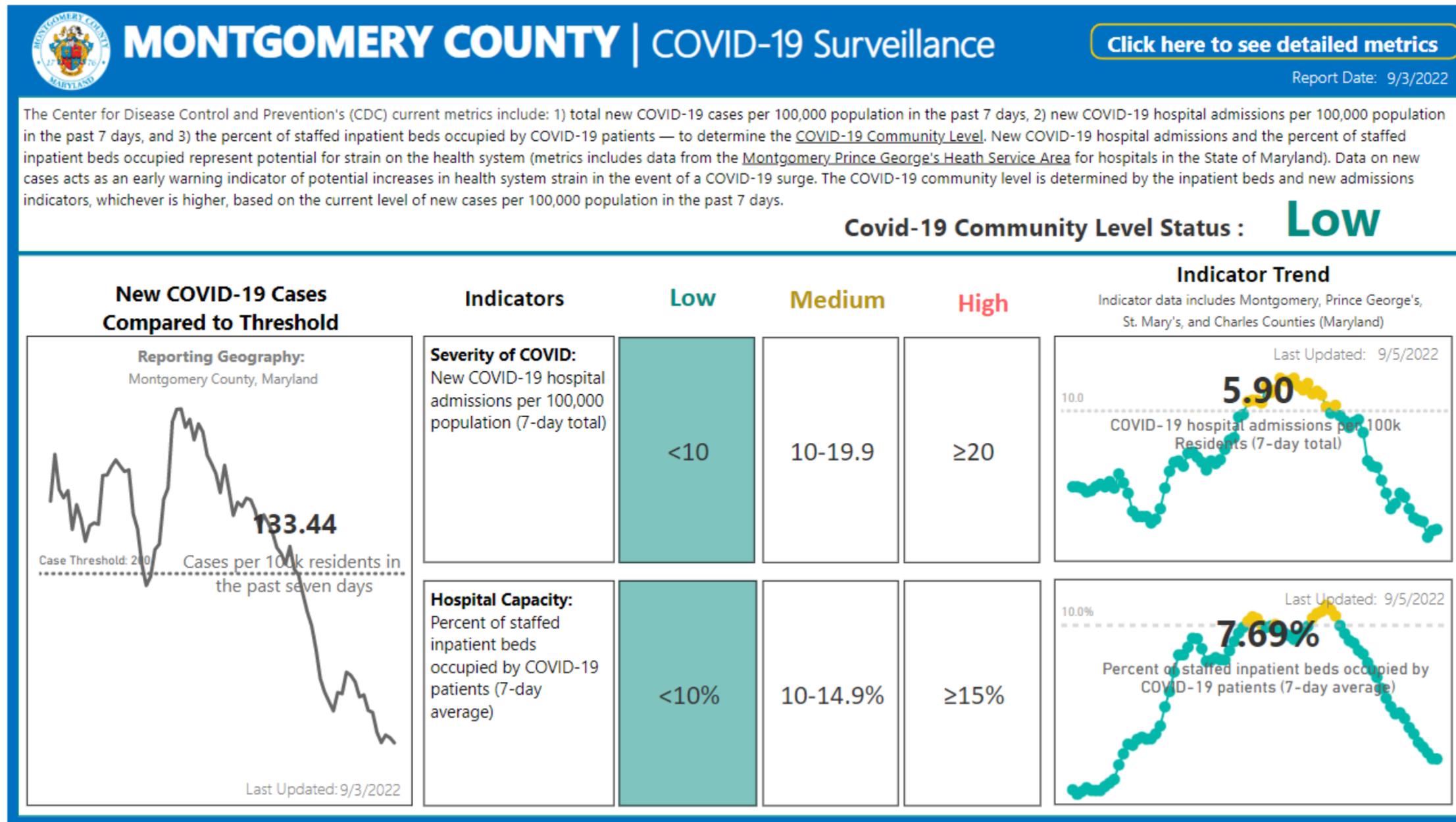
- New CDC guidance for schools

COVID-19 Community Risk Level: Montgomery County (September 5, 2022)



- Montgomery County has been at “**low**” risk since 8/16/22
- Weekly case rates, new COVID-19 hospital admissions and % of inpatient beds due to COVID-19 diagnosis trended down from last week.

COVID-19 VACCINATIONS: TOTALS FROM CDC

TOTAL VACCINATIONS (AS OF 8/24/22)

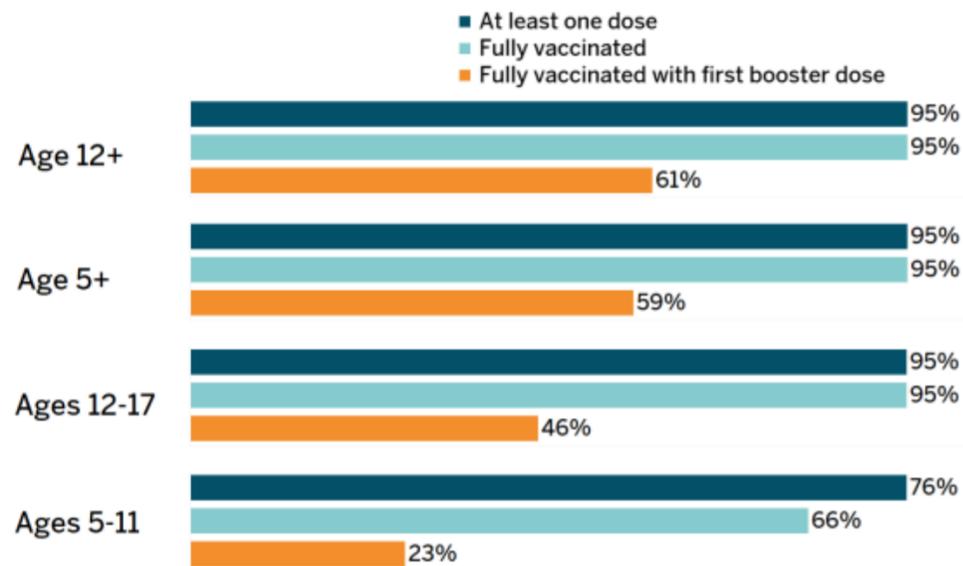
- **≥95%*** of total population received at least **ONE DOSE** [N=1,109,749]
- **90%** of total population received at least **TWO DOSES** (fully vaccinated) [N=941,114]
- **58%** of fully vaccinated population received a **FIRST BOOSTER/ADDITIONAL DOSE** [N=549,938]

*The CDC caps percentages at 95% to account for margins of error in data entry and population estimates.

NOTE: On 4/15/22, Maryland made updates to previously submitted data to the CDC that resulted in a decrease of 50,176 doses administered. Some percentages may have decreased as a result.

NOTE: The CDC vaccination count includes Montgomery County residents who received their shots in Maryland or outside the state. It also includes vaccinations administered in some federal entities within Montgomery County.

VACCINATIONS BY AGE GROUP



Percentage estimates for age groups 12-17 and 5-11 should be interpreted with caution due to higher margins of error in census population estimates.

- **80%** of the fully vaccinated 65+ population received a **FIRST BOOSTER/ADDITIONAL DOSE** [N=139,379]
- **51%** of the 50+ population with a first booster dose received a **SECOND BOOSTER** [N=143,510]

- Montgomery County continues to have generally high vaccination rates
- We can continue to work on improving vaccination rates in younger age groups and booster rates in all age groups

Update: Monkeypox Virus (MPX)

- According to the [CDC](#), as of September 6, 2022, there have been 20,733 cases in the US, including 554 cases in Maryland.
- According to the Maryland Department of Health [MPX data dashboard](#), on September 2, 2022 there were 62 cases in Montgomery County, increased from 57 cases on August 26, 2022
- MCPS has reviewed infection control policies to ensure consistency with CDC recommendations, partnered with DHHS to discuss prevention and case response strategies, and will continue to provide education to the community
